On 21st to 22nd of January partners from Lithuania, Latvia, Poland, Greece and Romania came together for the third partnership meeting in Tukums, Latvia. Summary of the tasks that have been done so far were presented and discussions took place about the next steps of the project SMART-MT.

The most important task that has been done is the development of two mobile apps “The Math app” and the “Eureka” app. There are still some things that have to be improved in order to make those apps useful and helpful for pupils from 5th-6th grade.

During the period between 2nd and 3rd partnership meetings some very important tasks were done – all the partners developed written success stories which are based on the personal experience of teachers, who, working with diverse groups of pupils, having different abilities and needs, many of whom come from different economic, religious, and socio-cultural backgrounds, are able to achieve excellent learning outcomes in mathematics and other STEAM subjects.

- 12 video success stories;
- 2 mobile apps to enable math teachers to differentiate and individualize the teaching/learning process.

In the following months, work will come to end on the curriculum for the Training course for Math teachers (IO1) “Teaching Maths in the Digital Era”, which will include 3 modules.

During the meeting in Tukums final decisions were made about the structure of the video success stories. In couple of months there will be 12 video success stories which will reveal how, with the help of modern teaching tools, to create a motivational learning environment which boosts pupils’ critical thinking and creativity. These success stories, written and video, will provide teachers of mathematics and other STEAM subjects with valuable advice and useful tips on how to improve pupils’ academic results and turn the lesson into an exciting journey through the world of numbers.
